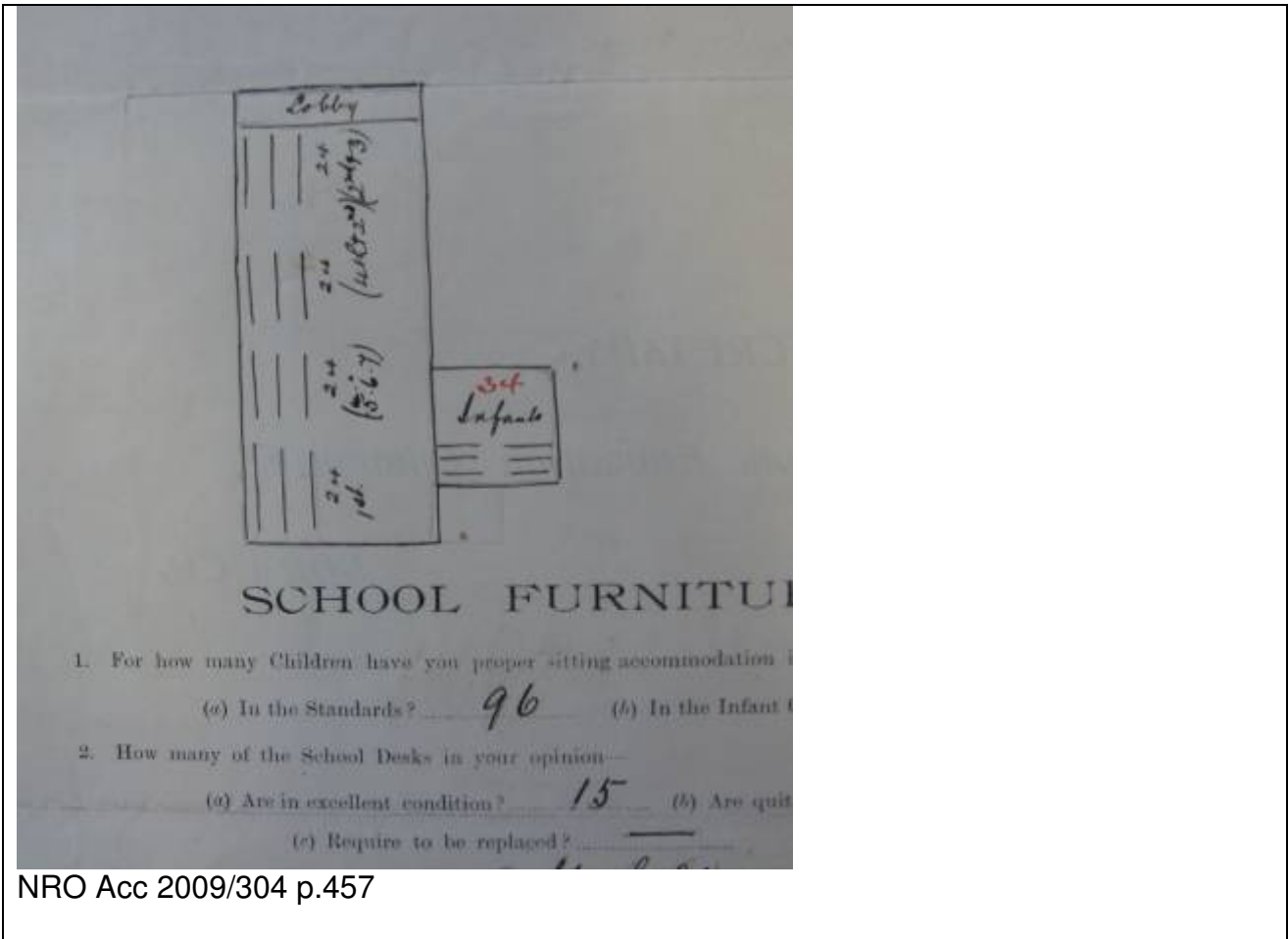

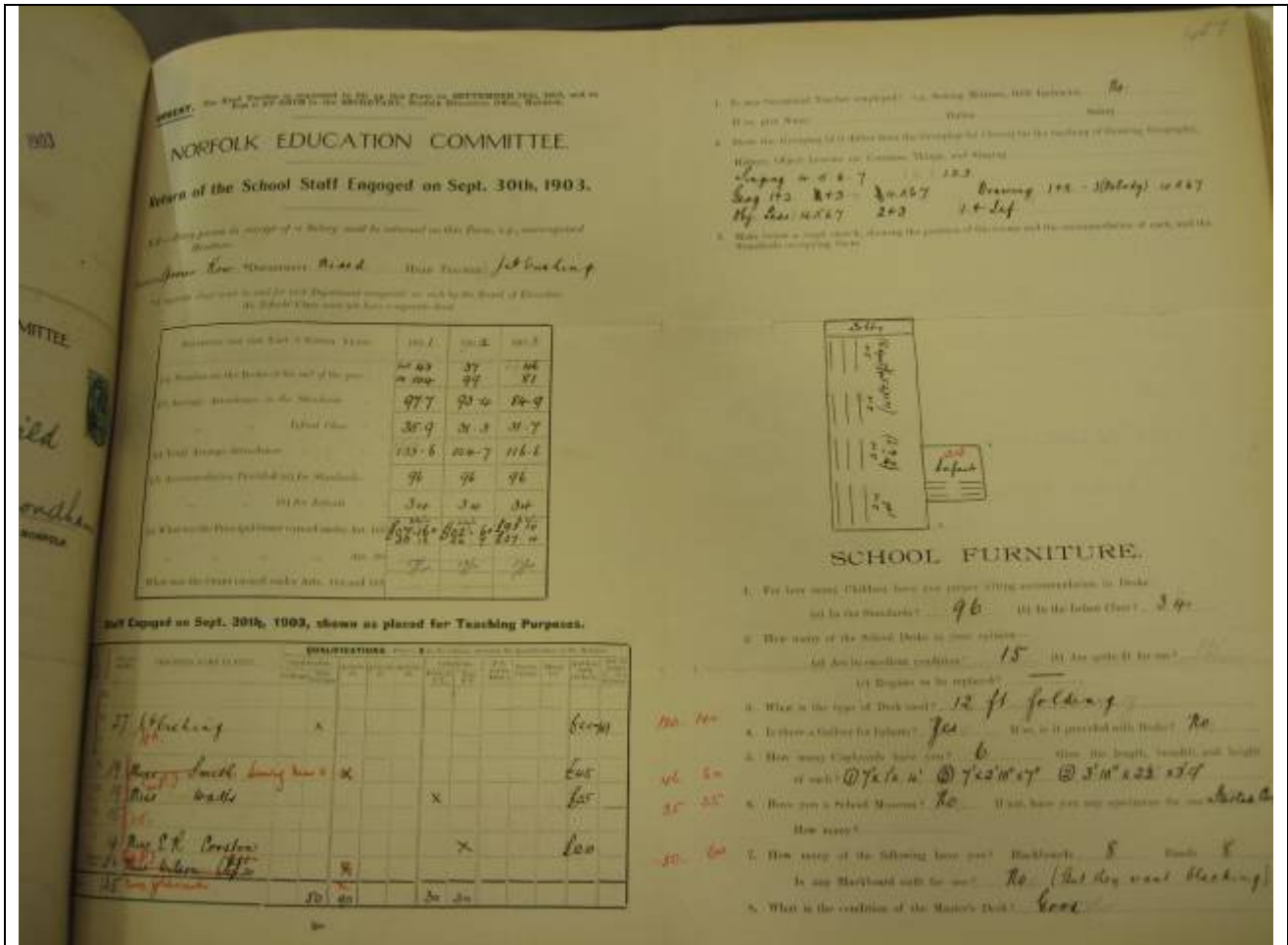
Plan at School
