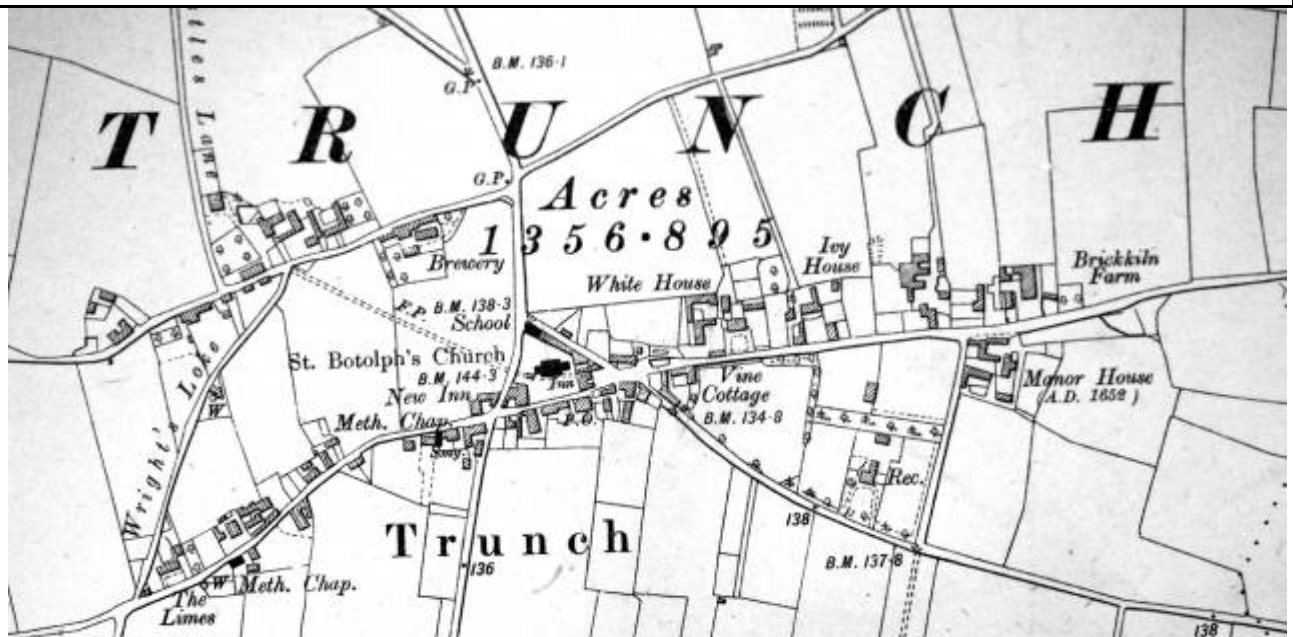

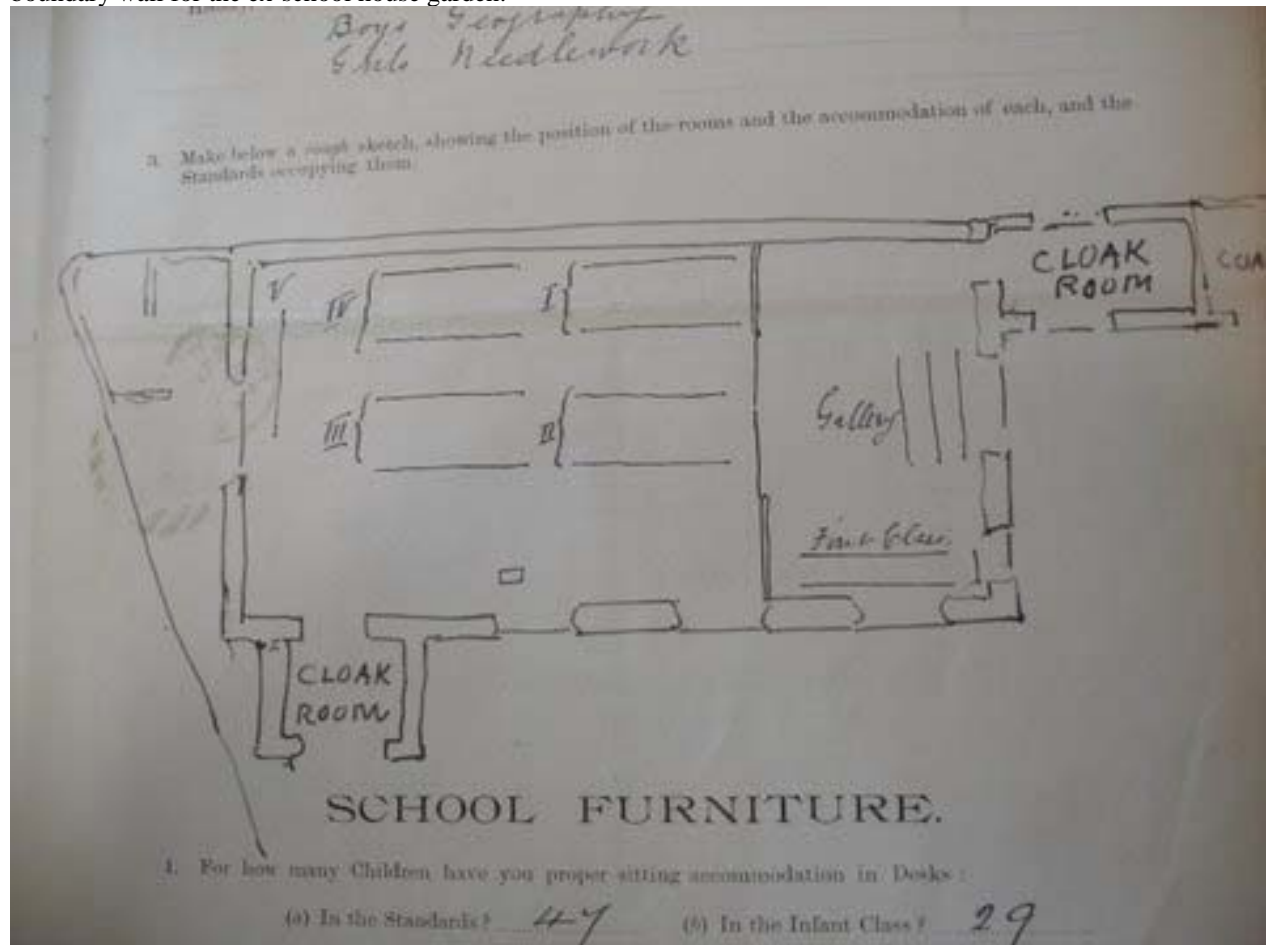

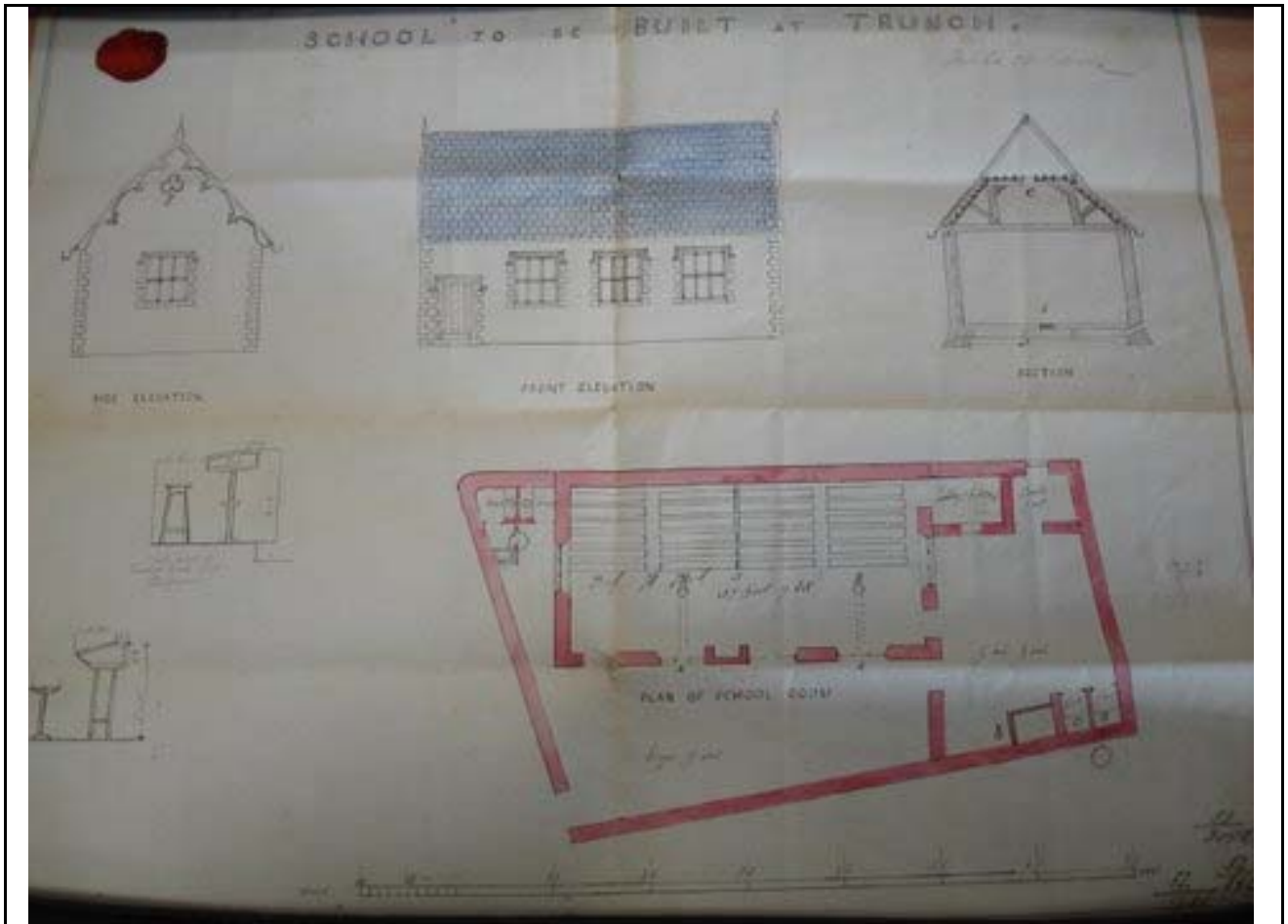

Only the north, side wall of this school survives, standing to eaves level, with blocked windows. It now forms the boundary wall for the ex-school house garden.

Building Features

Building sequence

Only one wall remains standing. The architect's plans show this wall so the building on the plan appears to have been built. A circular window with trefoil detail (as shown on the plan) survives as a garden feature.
